Introduction

In April or May 1832 George Johnstone (1786-1856) and his wife Polly Ann, (d. 1873) left Ireland for Canada with four of their children. One having died en route, they proceeded with the remaining three to Richmond Landing where they were met by Polly Ann's brother-in-law Hugh Bell. They lived in Nepean near Bell's Corners for five years before taking up land at Masham, Quebec.

George and Polly Ann's second daughter, Catherine(1812-1882), married William Moore Johnston (1810-1880) and in 1836 she and her husband finally made their way to Canada. They too went to Richmond Landing where they were met by Hugh Bell. Early in 1837 they moved to Masham with George and Polly Ann Johnstone. William and Catherine had eleven children of whom Edward James was the third and George B. was the sixth.

George B. Johnston (1845 to 1923) married Mary Ann Fairbairn (d. 1891) and Emily Brainard (d. 1948). At different times in his life George B. was a lumberman, photographer, school teacher, clerk, lay preacher, merchant and market gardener. In 1864 and 1865 he taught at No. 3 school Masham Township and was a clerk in lumber camps when school was closed. In 1873 he and his younger brother Robert (1848-1927) rented the general store at Meadow Bank Corners (Iascelles), Quebec and set up business under the name Johnston Bros. General Merchants. When Robert Johnston decided to seek his fortune in the opening West the partnership was dissolved and George B. moved to Ottawa where he took employment as a clerk with J.R. Booth. In 1882 he moved to Potsdam, New York, to work at Sherman-Johnston's Sawmill.

Edward James "Big Ned" Johnston (1836-1921) was born at sea when William and Catherine emigrated to Canada. In 1859 he moved to the Red River Colony but came back a few months lated, taking employment in a lumber camp. In 1861 he married Rebecca Cross. Edward eventually found a job with J.R. Booth and moved to Ottawa. From that time he was a lumberman (foreman or manager) for the rest of his life, moving from job to job at River Desert, Calabogie, Madawaska, Fort Eddy, Ottawa and Potsdam, New York. In 1891 he retired to Masham, Quebec where he served as minicipal councillor for a number of years.

The Johnston family papers were donated to the Public Archives in 1975 by Mrs. Reby (Johnston) Dodds of Ottawa. They are divided into four groups: manuscripts; photographs and sketches, transferred to the picture division; and publications, transferred to the Public

Archives Library. All manuscripts are in Volume 1 with the exception of Numbers 6, 7, and 15 which constitute Volumes 2, 3, and 4 respectively.

Finding Aid 942 is a descriptive list of the entire collection. Only the manuscripts were numbered so that the document number in the finding aid corresponds to a number on the document. Photographs, sketches and publications will be found using the reference systems in the Picture Division and Public Archives Library.

The index in this finding aid refers to subjects, people and places mentioned in the finding aid itself. The references given are those in the finding aid.
