BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Mr. Arthur Blight was born in Keokuk, Iowa on February 18, 1874 of Welsh parentage. His family moved to Canada soon after his birth and took up residence in Orono, Ontario, and then in Toronto. He attended the Givens Street School and Parkdale School as a boy and started working as a machinist at Massey-Harris. Through his singing at St. Albans Church in Parkdale and his marriage to the organist there, Letitia Whyte (probably in 1897), his interest in music grew. From a hobby, it soon turned into a full-time job with the help and encouragement of his wife. In 1904, he returned from coaching in England with William Shakespeare, an exponent of the Lamperti method (a technique of deep breath-control). From this time he had a busy and successful career as concert recitalist, church soloist and voice teacher.

Mr. Blight's activities were numerous and varied. He taught at the Ontario Ladies College at Whitby until 1927. He was a voice professor at the Toronto Conservatory of Music until his death. For a time, he was music director of CKNC, a radio station operated by Everready Battery on Davenport Road. Among the churches for which he provided his services as soloist or choirmaster were Parkdale Presbyterian, Old St. Andrew's, Metropolitan, Bloor Street Presbyterian and Trinity Methodist. He was a member of the Masonic Order and of the Arts and Letters Club. Despite all these duties, which included numerous singing engagements for social events such as afternoon teas and society evenings, he found time to participate in sports such as lawn bowling, boating and golfing.

With all this going on, Mr. Blight still put aside sufficent time to renew continuously his singing technique. His summers were frequently spent with prominent voice coaches in Canada and the United States. Mr. Blight died on September 2, 1928 after an operation for appendicitis.
