FRED H. BROWN COLLECTION

Fred H. Brown (b. Toronto, 1907) is a pianist, lecturer on music appreciation and CBC producer of recorded music programs (retired 1972). At times he uses the name F. Renwick Brown (Renwick being his mother's maiden name).
