National Continental Union League, an American Annexationist Movement

Thomas Burke Grant (alias Marcus Robinson), an American newspaperman, wrote to David Creighton, manager of the "Empire", from 24 Nov. 1893 to 22 Oct. 1894 reporting on the movements of the National Continental Union League whose headquarters were in Brooklyn, New York. Mr. Grant was a free lance writer who was evidently doing undercover work for the "Empire" of Toronto. In June 1894, Mr. Grant managed to get possession of copies of Francis Weyland Glen's (Secretary of the N.C.U.L.) correspondence and sent them in to Creighton. Copies were then made of all the corespondence and given to the Department of Justice where they were placed in a "Secret" file.
