 During the action which took place around here since last Tuesday one of the German bombs got away with half of the sign. Here are two Tommies looking at the sign. They are: L/Bdr. Bill Birdsye of The Kennels, Mugswell Chipstead, Coulsdon, Surrey, England (nearest to the camera) and Sgt. Jack Wade, 533 Fulham Road, London, England. These men are anti tank gunners with the 15th Scottish of the British Army. The sign indicates the original spot where the action towards Carpiquet began.
- 36132 - Confidence of the liberated Frenchmen are shown in these pictures
 36133 of Ernest Marie of Morrey en Bessen, Normandy already started
 36134 repairing his barn and house by clearing the debris caused by
 36135 the German guns. Although this spot is very much within the range of German shell fire the Frenchman expressed confidence in the advancing allies. He said, before long.... Paris and then Berlin. The photographer is also confident that his labour shall not be in vain.

- 36136 - Respect of religion of the soldiers of the Allied nations is
36137 shown in this picture. This small shrine which belonged to a humble French home was broken by the Gerry guns. As shown in the picture it was taken away and placed under the tree with the hopes that the returning owner who is probably seeking refuge elsewhere in Normandy will be able to place his respected shrine together. Note how the broken piece of the head lays peacefully on the body of the shrine and part of it although not the case looks like the wings of an angel. Trust photo reproduces the picture the photographer saw.
- 36138 - This memorial at Norrey-en-Bessen the replica of which is also
36139 at Cruelly stands in front of the famous church of the same town. In one hand the French soldier is holding the olive Branch of peace. Now amidst ruin this same statue is contributing towards the victory of this war. Around it are wound the wires of the communication lines of the Allied forces. *ES*
- 36140 - Shows the 122 Pioneer Coy, British, repairing the roads. These
36141 men have been working day and night repairing roads all the way from
36142 the beaches up to the front lines. Most of the stones are taken
36143 from the ruins of houses and churches thus helping the French clearing the debris and widening their roads.
- 36144 - Shows the 14th Light Field Ambulance of the British spotted in a
36145 place to receive casualties from the Caen Carpiquet front. These men have attended to many Canadians and they are equiped almost as extensively as a hospital.
