

- 37545 - Bailey Bridges, which have been hurriedly put up over the River Orne, are aiding Canadian troops in their advance on the front south of Caen. In this picture a truck is seen emerging from one end of a Bailey Bridge over the Orne river on the outskirts of Fleury-sur-Orne.
- 37546 - Clean trucks are just as essential in the front lines as they are at home. Pictured here is Spr. F.E. Archibald of the R.C.E. of Wildwood, Alta., using a pressure hose to wash off his truck. The water is from the Orne river and the picture was made on the outskirts of Fleury-sur-Orne.
