Mascot Story

1st Cdn Para Bn. Overseas.

The new mascot of the Cdn Para Bn. overseas is a big good natured 80 pound Alsatian--- Johnny Canuck..

His master and Keeper Sgt. Peter Joseph Kowalski come from Tarnopole Sask. He took the dog under his wing when it wandered into the Bn. guard room about a month ago. An immediate friendship was ~~XXX~~ established between Sgt. Kowalski and the dog and now they are both inseparable, the dog following him wherever duty calls.

Sgt. Kowalski is the Provost Sgt. of the 1st Cdn Para Bn a fully qualified jumper with 15 descents to his credit. He has undertaken to qualify the Bn. mascot who will have to make his hops from a static balloon. He will leave the cage of the balloon first beckoning the mascot to follow him. The dog is required to make five descents before he is put on Bn. strength.

Bn. C.O. Col. GFP. Braðbrooke has taken a keen interest in the mascot's future with the Bn. He authorized Sgt. Kowalski to teach and train the dog the art of parachuting and agreed to have him put on Bn. orders as soon as he completed his series of jumps.

The dog will jump with a regulation chute on his back which ^{should} ~~XXXX~~ give him a light landing since a man using the same 24' chute usually hits the deck with comparative ease. A special harness is being made for the dog by the Bn. rigger. qB

It is likely that the mascot will be utilized to carry with the ammunition or medical supplies when the unit is in operations. He has been taught to carry articles with his mouth and willingly carries mail and other odds and ends when he is making the rounds with his master.

For Johnny Canuck there is the distinction of the first dog to make a parachute jump with a Cdn Bn. but he is not the first dog to leap with a chute from an aircraft as an Alsatian with a Para training school in the US. has made a number of free descents as has a mascot of a Br. Airborne unit in the Middle East.

The garden which was a block or bluff of Scotch pine 16 Jan 43 is now in full production and has produced in the past 12 months 174 pounds cucumber, 593 pounds tomatoes, 1073 lbs onions, 1290 lbs lettuce, 11230 lbs potatoes, 819 lbs carrots, 1340 lbs beans as well as radishes, leeks, cabbages, beets, celery, etc. The actual price of products came to £318. Savings in regimental funds were approximately £180. It looked after an average of 750 men with an average of three men per day, including the clearing, employed on the ground.
