We forged further shead to the next house when I saw a wounded pal laying on the grass. Despite his agony he seemed to wounded pal laying on the grass. Despite his agony he scened to warn me of something. The was trying to tell me of another sniper in the other house. I placed my bron down and unfortunately I stopped on an (S) mine. It exploded and did not reach my wounded pal but a piece of shrapmel as you see went through my helmet and just missed my skull and injured me slightly.
