Tower was in charge of a mortar section and was waiting for the sappers to clear the mine field when a German trench mortar fired on them. Tower spotted the location of the German mortar which was behind the sand doon. He got his rifle and crawled up to the top and after firing his first round which got a German he was spotted by a sniper and got wounded. The trench mortar he later learned met their maker.

34145 - Pte. Clifford Hogan of Vilna Alberta. Hogan

34146 was in action for about half an hour after he landed. In the thick of trench mortar fire he received fragments from a shell which exploded near him.

34148 (WOII) Ernie Funston WAG RCAF lost an arm in Italy

Having heard that there were some wounded from France in the hospital he rushed to the ward to try and seek information about his brother and met Wilf. Until Wilf received his wound, Clifford and he were together and he is O.K. Funstons are from Conn Ont.

 34152 with Pte. Robert Grist of Portage La Prairie Man. Grist after landing safely fought for about half an hour and got hit by fragments from a mortar shell.

Croix of 4645 Ontario Street, East Montreal, Que., has to say about the piece of shrapnel which found its way into his steel helmet. Here is the account as told by Ste. Croix. "We left our big transport and got into the landing barges. Everyone started singing 'We are the Liberators'. As we approached the shore everyone was silent. We did not want to make anymore noise than necessary. The ramp was lowered and we dashed out into a machine gun cross fire. I forged ahead through the firing and don't ask me how I did it and kept on forging ahead and went through the hole in the sea wall which was made by the rocket ships. My first view was of two houses quite spread apart by a field and we spotted a sniper in the first one. He offered resistance and we won. We forged further ahead to the next house when I saw a wounded pal laying on the grass. Despite his agony he seemed to warn me of something. He was trying to tell me of another sniper in the other house. I placed my bron down and unfortunately I stopped on an (S) mine. It exploded and did not reach my wounded pal but a piece of shrapnel as you see went through my helmet and just missed my skull and injured me slightly.

Our mashers are certainly more powerful than the Gerry's and has a lot of guts to it".
