TURNER, first wounded in the left shoulder at Novelle while serving the Princess Louise Fusilier Guards, he was put out of action on 13 Dec 44 during a night attack on the Italian front. His left leg was saved thanks to the surgical wizardry of our Canadian Corps, as a special operation was performed on his left knee. Mrs MCNAUL and her son still live at Moose Jaw.
