GILMORE, 67 yr old widow, of Aldershot, was among scores of English shop keepers and residents of Aldershot who sustained heavy property damage in disturbances by Our soldiers on two nights in succession.

Since her husband died, 20 yrs ago this month, Mrs. GILMORE has carried on in her confectionery shop through the good yrs and bad, striving constantly to raise and educate her family of three sons and one daughter. That she did so, admirably, is attested in the record her children have made in this war. Two of the sons were killed in service with British fighting arms.

They are her eldest son, Pilot Offr CHARLES GEORGE GILMORE, who was a fighter pilot with the R.A.F. and was shot down over Germany in 1941. He had received a Bachelor of Science Degree from the London University prior to enlisting in the R.A.F. A second son, CAPT. WALTER JAMES GILMORE, was with the Norfolk Regt. in the 1st Arty, and was killed in April 1943, in the bitter Tunisian campaign. He had been a solicitor before enlisting. The third son, JOHN, is an engineer, while the daughter, AGNES, is a nurse and her husband is serving in the R.A.C.

In her own words, the confectionery store was the only means of support for herself and her family that the 67 yr old lady has had. She had already suffered heavily in this war and both she and her fellow townfolk consider she has already carried more than her fair share of the toll of war. This last blow to her means of livelihood is almost too much.
