- 59906- Though milk is a strictly rationed commodity in England, there'll be lots of it for little 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  year old Anne Rae when she gets to her new home in Toronto's Mount Dennis. Here, with her mother, Mrs Elizabeth Rae, wife of Cpl. J. Rae of 52 Bushy Ave., Toronto, Anne gets her last pint of English milk from the family milkman in front of her home at 20 Nayer Road Brixton London.
- 59907- Another feature of English life that Elizabeth Rae will miss--with gratitude--will be the famous London queues. Here she is forced to stand for over an hour before reaching the counter of the grocers at Brixton Market. It's a wearying business for little Anne too, but this Saturday morning session was the last for the Raes.
- 59908- Anne and her mother buy a head of celery from a small side walk stall in Brixton market. Wrapping facilities are primitive due to England's paper shortage; virtually everything goes into the ubiquitous shopping bag.
- 59909- With a touch of sadness Elizabeth Rae waits as Anne drops a sixpence into the cap of a crippled street musician. A familiar sight in London, Mrs Rae has been told that they are almost a rarity in Canada.
