Note: A Company of P.P.C.L.I. moved up as forward troops in the forward brigade against Jerry only a few miles away. Our troops occupied a hill-top ~~in~~ feudal castle built by Frederick II (German) in the year 1242. It is now owned by Italian Prince Doria Pamphili (who married a Scots woman) <sup>30</sup> under internment up to time of Armistice (by Italians) as an anti-Fascist.
