Story: Before and after Pic taken of wounded Location: North of Ortona at an R.A.P. at the Front.

NOTE: I was doing some work at an R.A.P. (Seaforth Highlanders) at the front when three officers of the American Field Service drove up in a jeep to visit one of their ambulance driver's attached to the RAP (Volunteer J.B. Chaffee Providence, R.I.) They were about to drive off when on the Seaforth M.C.'s suggestion, I pressed them to stay for a photograph. As soon as the photos were taken I walked into the RAP; they stepped into their jeep. A mortar bomb fell 17 feet from the ambulance (the jeep was parked nearby) wounding one of the visitors severely and wounding another in the head (minor wound) also a Seaforth first aid man who was nearby and a major from the Pay Corps. First of two pix are posed beside ambulance and show all the men involved. Others show wounded men and ambulance after bomb fell. These could well be used in short series, before and after...Ro.

- 29740 -Captain Payne and Sgt. Warden (with head bandaged) talking outside RAP after Warden's wounds treated.
- 29741 -Sgt. Warden was seated in back seat of keep unable to get out in time whe n he heard bomb coming. He was hit by shrapnel in back of head and is shown in RAP having it dressed.
- 29742 -The ambulance, standing only few feet from the RAP was ruined by the blast, temporarily at least. All tires were flattened the gas tank punctured, body and engines plastered with shrapnel. Bomb fell on side opposite the one picture (1) and (2) were taken on.

 In this pic taken few minutes after bomb fell Pte. Stanley Larsen a Seaforth first aid man from Bella Villa B.C. is standing in the mortar hole, ambulance shows in background.
- 29743- Captain Flahiff, E.W., of Toronto 3rd F.D.S. pointing out shrapnel holes in door and window of ambulance. The driver had left the cab. Only he and Capt. Payne escaped injury. Elapsed time between pic 1 and 2 and the following about 3 minutes.
- 29744 -Hobbs leaving RAP on stretcher for evacuation to a M.D.S. down the line.
- 29745- Hobbs, his back peppered with shrapnel shown in RAP receiving a hypodermic from first aid Corp Quinton Carsell Vancouver Seaforths. Hobbs had been through Africa war without wounds. He received most of shrapnel as it caught him leaping for cover from the jeep. Also wounded face, legs, chest.
