entered by Canadian troops Lieut. Rowe crossed the ground
which now forms the cemetery, on his way to obtain some
of the finest war pictures ever taken.

STORY:

On the morning of Feb 20, the operational staff of 1 Cdn Armd Bde received a call from 13 British Corps HQ asking for a ski party to carry food supplies and medical services to some stranded detachments of the 36 Recce Regt in the mountainous country of middle Italy. In answer to the call, the bde sent a party of 73 all ranks under the command of Capt. Duncan Morrison of Ottawa were loaded on to trucks and rushed back to the small mountain town of Atessa. The party arrived at the rear base at 4.30 the same day and by nine o'clock were completely outfitted with new ski equipment and warm clothing. At 9 a.m. the next morning, after a short night's sleep in an English camp, 50 experienced skiers, five officers including an M.O. and assisting troops left under the guidance of officers from the British Corps to establish a forward base at the end of the cleared road.

The town of TORNARECCIO, towering high above the valley of the Sangro and overlooking the valley from the snow-covered mountain on which it was built was the end of the road for the trucks. While the tank-men were being billeted in the town which was cleared of its last German a month and half before, a small party went on ahead to see how much more of the road could be covered in jeeps and to make plans accordingly. The sleepy village was aroused, the carabinieri (cops) were sent on the search, and households were opened to provide sleeping accommodation, but the skiers after having deposited excess baggage, had not even time to cook up a lunch for train was to start the first relay immediately. Luckily most of the men had adjusted their fittings the night before, but on this first sortie most of the new skis went with a slight waxing, or none at all. Not more than an hour and a half after arriving in the town, skiers, equipment, and the all important rations were again loaded on to vehicles and heading for a crossroads about four miles further on. As there were two outposts to be supplied, this was the dividing point for two parties...one under the command of Capt. G.W. Hamm of Regina to Collidemezzo and the other under the command of Capt. Morrison to Montazzoli. As the latter lies on one of the more important roads a couple of bull-dozers beat the skiers to the town but the other, thought not completely as they wished, Capt. Hamm's party had the honour of skiing into the town with the first rations to reach the outpost in days. They were warmly welcomed by the troops of the recce regt and though things were not as dire as first believed, the rations brought relieved the 75% shortage.

That evening when the men regathered in the town which formed their base, orders came through from Corps HQ that the forecast for the area threatened more snow and drifting wind, and that the party was to remain until further orders. Good news for these men who had come from front-line positions made even better by the knowledge that they would receive coaching and instructions in finer arts of the sport from the senior NCO. RSM F.R. Prevost of Montreal. "Fritz" Prevost, in civvie street, was Skiing Instructor for Chateau Frontenac in Quebec and for Hotel Mount Royal in Montreal.

Mrs Angela Bozzello, shown serving Paul Morton, Toronto Star Correspondent in 'kitchen' at one of caves exits, says: "It's not very comfortable in wet weather, but at least it's safer for the children."
- 30211 - Mrs Giulia Iarlura, shown setting plates in shelf cut into wall says: "We are better off than the townspeople. It's at least warm in my cave, and I'd rather be here than in Ortona. It's cleaner."
- 30212 - Sleeping in a cave is fun to this small boy. His sister hauls off boot says: "It 's just the same for me as at home Same jobs ..."
- 30213 - Greatest worry of Mrs Maria Storta, shown putting son Armando, 8, and daughter Givliana ,5, to bed, are the many German mines still buried on the hill-side, When she calls out "Careful, children, you might get hurt" she really means it.

- 30242 Arrival in the town of Tornareccio the forward base
 30243- of the ration carrying party. Billets found in various parts of the small mountain town, the troopers unload and carry their gear down a narrow street.
- 30244- Most of the population turned out to welcome the unexpected visitors. A general shot of the melee that aroused the peasant inhabitants from their near-peacetime routine of life. Five minutes after the arrival, everybody from the town-mayor down to small children were dashing about trying to help the Canucks.

The sleds were made overnight by Br. soldiers under Canadian direction out of spare skis and army stretchers.

The drifting snow of the rugged white mountainside blocks the road ahead, and at this point the rations to be delivered to the British troops are loaded on to the sleds, and from this moment on it's man power that does the trick.

30250 - vehicles which tried unsuccessfully to get through made an excellent run and saved some of the bother of trail-breaking.

Using new types of issue equipment they showed how proper loading of weapons food etc. should be done when soldiers are required to carry their own supplies.

He left there at the age of seven and went to Montreal where he has a home at 7476 Berri Street. He is married and has one child. This is a day in his life that he took out to visit all his relatives in Casacalenda. This is his first visit to his home town since leaving it 23 years ago.

Pte Battista is a very well known musician having been a featured artist on several large radio features. He brought news of Montreal's "Little Italy" to all citizens of this town; their first bit of news since Italy's participation in the war. There is a Casacalenda Mutual Aid Society in Montreal made up of all Italian citizens who migrated to Canada from this little town.
