An Allied Food Train, consisting of thousands of pounds of flour as well as other essentials of life was brought into Paris to-day. The French people, who recently were under German domination, used German prisoners to unload some of the trucks at the Gare De Marchandes. Members of the F.F.I. acted as gaurds over the German prisoners. French women as well as men assisted in the unloading, the women wheeling trucks around with same apparent ease as their fellowmen.

Wounded and taken prisoners by the Germans at Veriers, near Caen, on July 21, when the 2nd. Canadian Infantry Division was making its great push towards Falaise three members of the Fusiliers Mount Royal ended up in a German controlled Hospital in Paris. Before the city was liberated by French & Americain troops, the three were taken by French nurses in the hospital to another place in the city and kept in hiding there until the Allied soldiers took over the city. One of them, Cpl. Jules Parent, 2068 Chambly Street, Montreal, who was wounded in the leg, assisted Maj. Fernand Mousseau of Hull, Que., in working with the F.F.I. in organization work with the maderground movement. But his leg became sore again and he had to return to his place of hiding. Maj. Mousseau worked on with the F.F.I. and has since left to rejoin his unit, also the F.M.R. The three are now being cared for in the Salpetriere Hospital by French nurses and a doctors. They are able to move about although their wounds are not entirely healed. They said their medical care by the Germans was practically nil and that they went for days with the same bandages. When the Germans evacuated the hospital, which is the oldest in Paris, they took all medical supplies with them, leaving wounded Germans behings.

A gaurd of French soldiers has been posted at the hospital to prevent any of the soldiers from escaping. Assisting the French nursem are two members of the Saniteater German Red Cross workers. The Germans are being given the best of care in contrast to the poor medical treatment the Canadian soldiers received when they were in the same hospital. A number of Canadian wounded soldiers who were in hospital at the time Paris was liberated were taken back by the retreating Germans.

Dieppe harbour, which has been in German hands for the past four years, is again operating bringing in supplies from Britain for the Allied armies in Europe. By the use of the harbour supply lines to the front have been considerably shortened. Before the Germans evacuated the town without putting up a struggle for it, they carried out demolitions along the wharfs and even sunk ships across the mouth of the harbour to prevent the Allies from using it immediately. However, soon after the town was taken by the Canadians, engineers went to work and it was not long until L.C.T's and other small craft were making their way from England to Dieppe loaded with supplies. In a few days time it is expected, that ships of 3,000 tons will be able to use the harbour.
