Millions of maps of practically every country in the world and special detailed maps of England, which the Germans had planned to use in the event of their invasion of England, have been uncovered in Brussels. The maps of England are in the greatest of detail and in addition each city has an illustrated booklet giving pictures detail of important buildings, factories, military barracks, etc. The maps are revised up to a year ago. They are stored in the basement of a mansion in Brussels in innumerable racks and packages. In another section of the city there are additional millions of maps stored in an underground garage. In this place the maps are all bundled up apparently ready for use. In addition to England there are maps of every city in Ireland together with illustrated booklets. Now the Allied are making good use of these captured maps. They are in the act of cancelling the maps and cutting them down to standard army size and reprinting on the backs. The mansion, which the Germans occupied, is owned by Baron Louis Empain, a banker of the Banque of Belge. His father at one time owned and operated a summer and winter resort north of Montreal, Que.

Final firing trials of the Landmattress-rocket batteries of the artillery- took place today at the artillery range in the area of Helcheteren, Belgium. The trials, which were witnessed by high army officials, took the form of some observed shooting confined to a small proportion of the equipment and the engagement of an area target by prediction of all available equipment. The landmattress is a rocket projector, firing 32 rockets at second intervals, or, if the occasion demands, a single rocket or any number. It is mounted on a small trailer and is quite mobile-another of its many features. The rockets are loaded into tubular affairs, then, just before they are ready for firing, spoilers are placed on the projectile which retards or regulates the speed of the rocket. There are three different sizes of spoilers. The weapon has a range from 3900 yards to 7900 yards and is fired from between 30 to 45 degrees. When the rockets have been fixed they are fired from some distance back by a man operating a hand held switch.
