52267 - Veteran Br. Cdn fighters from Sicily and Italy landings  
 52268 were in an excellent position to realise why the term  
 52269 'Fortress Holland' had come into being when they took  
 52270 over protection of the elaborate coastal defences and  
 52271 their German occupants from the infuriated Dutch people.  
 52272 The crack bridgehead lads found a vast defence system  
 52273 extending two or three miles inland. There were intricate  
 52274 tunnel systems built of solid cement which literally  
 52275 extended miles and miles. All the 'gerries' lived under-  
 52276 ground level and their 'houses' were all covered over  
 52277 by the sand dunes. There was either desolate sand or  
 52278 just as desolate green rolling hills, but under that  
 52279 innocent surface was a possibly impregnable defence  
 52280 system, probably, because the Canucks never took a crack  
 52281 at it from the sea.

52282 The German who goose-stepped their way into Holland,  
 52283 or rolled in on military machinery the like of which the  
 52284 world had never seen before, or even been able to  
 52285 anticipate, dragged their feet and hand made carts  
 52286 of the rudest construction when they started to march from  
 52287 their fortress to their self-designated concentration  
 52288 areas. The contrast can only be shown with pictures if  
 52289 pix of their proud march into occupied Europe are  
 52290 studied again.

52291 At their camps and storehouses they packed away  
 52292 their food and other stores. They load up the military  
 52293 eqpt and transport it in Cdn driven trucks, then  
 52294 unload it again. They also handle their ration and  
 52295 food stores. These will be used to feed Germans on their  
 52296 long trek to their once beloved Fatherland.

The Germans who capitulated in the fortress Holland are working for their living. They are 'packing up' and literally. No longer do they bask along Holland's Hook - - the country's lovely summer resort area. They are packing up all their guns, their ammo, their rations and their females. The transport is 'kaput', just like their ambitions, but the Canucks of the 1st Can Div are supplying them with the vans, while they supply the manpower. Rather fortunately for them, the Germans were great on outdoor exercise - - they're getting it now. They march along miles to their concentration areas, and these are only practices for their 'conducted' trek to Germany which will start as soon as they have rounded themselves up and delivered themselves to veterans of Sicily and Italy.

On the first Sunday after VE day, the 49th British Div. paraded in the town of Utrecht. The church service was conducted to give thanks for the victory of Allied forces in Europe, and was held in the large cathedral of the town which was first entered by the Div. after the surrender of the Germans. Representatives of all units in the West riding division took part in the service.

Following the church ceremony, LT.GEN. FOULKES, under whose command the div had worked, took the salute at a march past. LT.GEN. led his men through the ceremonial march past and afterwards joined FOULKES on the saluting base. As representative of the thousands of spectators who lined the streets to cheer the troops, the Burgomeister accompanied the generals during both ceremonies.
