"Miss Canada" to thousands of troops visiting the city of Paris on leave, is Lt. THERESE VAILLER, of Montreal, Que., only CWAC offr stationed in the French capital.

Lt. VAILLER is employed as an administration offr with the Cdn Military Staff in Paris. She is the daughter of Maj. GEN. G.P. VAILLER, Cdn Ambassador to France and Mrs. VAILLER.

Born in England, Therese came to Canada at an early age, living with her family in Montreal. At the age of eight, she went to Switzerland for schooling, and two years later to England. In 1939, she moved with her family to France and remained there until the time of the German occupation in 1940. When the Germans were marching into Paris, the VAILLERS were on a cattle boat starting a perilous journey across the English channel and back to Canada.

In 1942, Therese felt a restless desire to do something useful, so she left Canada to enlist with the WRC in England. Here, she assisted carrying wounded personnel from ships to hospitals. Shortly after the first draft of CWAC personnel had landed in the U.K. Therese transferred to the Cdn Army. She served for a year as a court stenographer at a Cdn Reinforcement Unit in England, and in June, 1944 attended an Offrs' Trg Course with the British ATS.

Shortly after she had received her commission, she was posted to Paris and given the appointment she currently holds.

Story: 1000th student to attend the leave course at the Sorbonne.

So far, all the students who have attended the leave course at the Sorbonne have been Cdns. In 1936 Canada established a 'Maison' in City Universitaire; this was to house Cdn students attending the university. At the time of the occupation, all 'maisons' were closed. The Germans used the Maison Canadienne as an HQ for the German Chief of Staff. The Cdns were the first to re-open their 'maison' and the beginning of this week marks the enrollment of the 1,000th Cdn service student to attend a leave course at the university. The course is of a week's duration, includes informal lectures on French culture etc., sightseeing trips around Paris, visits to French homes, free tickets to 'operas and ballets.'

CAPT. C.C. HOFFMAN, of Montreal, represents the Cdn Army Educational Services in Paris and also cares for the other two Cdn services. He works with the Cdn Legion Educational Services. Dr. A. CHATWIN, of Saskatoon, is the head of this outfit, and his Paris rep is MR.S. TOPSHINE, of Sydney, N.S.
