In the area under the control of Cdn Army of Occupation, are 150,000 German tps, plus many thousands of German civilians. German tps are concentrated in the area North of the Jade-Ems Canal. This area is like a large unfenced prison camp as one must cross the canal to reach other parts of Germany. Each unit in the CAOP have daily patrols throughout this area. This job is far from dull and the tps enjoy it very much.

Today we went out with the Regt. de la Chaudiere on one of their patrols. Fiery CAPT. LUCIEN DUMAS, MC, MM, of Montreal, Que, had thirty men in his patrol travelling in scout cars, Bren carriers, trucks and jeeps, armed with rifles, Stens, grens, Bren guns, and even, too, flame-throwing carriers. The element of surprise is used as these patrols swoop down on an area where there are tps billeted sometimes in farm houses and sometimes in bks. Civilians and soldiers alike are checked to see if their papers are in order. Highlight of the trip was a surprise visit to the huge Military Bks at Essens, where there are billeted 2,000 tps, mostly Wehrmacht, but amongst them are 850 of Hitler's Elite Storm Troopers who bear plenty of watching but have lost much of their cockiness and arrogance.

to check for bodily cleanliness or possible skin
diseases. Scabies are very prevalent with German
soldiers.

and followed by the German Lt.Col.
- 56827 - CAPT. DUMAS questions papers of a tall fancily

the armpit and left a tiny hole. CAPT. DUMAS is

this positive check.

DUMAS gave them a little demonstration of our
latest flame thrower mounted on a Bren gun carrier
leaving the suggestion on the flame covered square of
what might have happened to them if they had continued
the fight.
- 56831 - As quickly as they arrived, the Chaudieres left,
immediately following the flame throwing demonstration.
Their carriers are shown sweeping out of the camp gates
with Chaudiere guards at the gates. During the
inspection the camp gates were kept locked with Cdn
guards to enforce the order given by CAPT. DUMAS
upon his arrival that all within the camp would
remain until his inspection was completed.

Aurich is an agricultural centre with a peacetime population of 6000 and now has approx. 8900 persons. The extra peoples are mainly displaced bodies from war-battered sections of Western Germany. Aurich itself has little or no war damage as, at the time of the cessation of hostilities, it was still 15 miles beyond the front.

Along religious lines the people are mainly Lutheran with a few Roman Catholics. Today, more go to church than during the war yrs. During Hitler's regime religious teaching was banned in the schools. Schools have not been open since 1943 but will now re-open in Sep of this yr for children from 6 to 10 yrs of age. Arrangements for educating older children is in hand and dates will be announced later. The town has a solid peasant population.

Aurich district is noted all over the world for its fine horses and cattle. The town itself is like all German towns under full Military Government control - the policing is done by civilian police under the supervision of A.M.G. direction. Being in the centre of a rich agricultural area, there is naturally no queuing for food as in larger centres of Germany today.

Today's national holiday in Holland, commemorating the Relief of Groningen in 1672, was celebrated in this city by a gala horse show, with steeple chasing. Close to 15,000 travelled from all parts of the province of Groningen to see the finest of horseflesh that Holland has at the present time. Many horses were ridden by Cdns, and several entries were from the 'Maroon Hunt Club', a 5 Div HQ enterprise, which consists of horses mainly recruited from Germany.

It was a very successful show, with beautiful displays of hackneys, harness horses, pack hack, hunters and jumpers. In the jumping the finest exhibition was from Mej. R. Mulder ten Cate (or Miss). Her riding of the horse 'michou' (Mee-shoo) was applauded terrifically by the audience, as she took all the hurdles as though she and the horse were one.

Any good German will tell you that because he didn't know all about Dakou and the other concentration camps that he is totally innocent of the war -- and already many of the occupational tps seem willing to agree that about 10% of the German race is responsible for the war. Responsibility for the bombing of London, Rotterdam, Coventry - the brutal pistol-point shooting of Cdn, English and U.S. P.o.W - not to mention 'reprisal' slayings in all the occupied countries, including pillaged Italy, is being forgotten in the overwhelming brutality of the death camps.

The Germans steadfastly maintain that each did not want a war - but that it was the Nazis who wanted it - the writer has yet to meet a German, male or female, who admits ever being a member of the country's most popular party - the one which went into power in 1933 during a free election with a majority which swept all opposition into oblivion. This is the party which the people supported, and it was this party which made every child a rabid militarist! Juvenile propoganda was not of the party, Liberal, Conservative, Communist, CCF or Nazi - it was the propoganda of WAR.

A youngster going to kindergarten did not learn that two apples, pears, or sweets plus two more equalled four delicacies. He was taught that two tanks, planes, or soldiers plus two more equalled four tks, planes, or soldiers. His nursery rhymes were about Hitler youth and their exploits. So complete was the Nazi militarizing of Germany's whole educational system that not a single school book previously in common use can be accepted by the new regime which is being set up under direction of Military Govt. All readers, spellers, geographies, mathematical and copy books have been collected and placed under lock and key - later to be pulped.

Another delicate little angle was that the Germans collected all the available Bibles in the country, ostensibly to be sent to the service-men 'at the front.' However, they were pulped and their sheets final use had nothing to with learning.

Today the only books which are fit for children to study the German languages as written and printed are Bibles and religious hymnaries and song books, and these are now in such short supply that communities must be canvassed by the children house to house in the hope of success, which sometimes just isn't.

During the past three to four years education of all sorts, exclusive of technical trg which was directly in conjunction with war plants, has been gradually dwindling. First the higher forms closed so that the students could be employed in the war, then the younger ones were sent from school into the factories and fields, and finally a yr ago or so everything was closed down so that the teachers themselves, might be put to national use in the direct war effort.

Throughout the area occupied by the Canadians the children and their parents are over-joyed that the prospect of the schools being opened again, and the 'kinder' are going to work with a vim and vigour which is astounding. It is anticipated that it will be another three months before a complete line of school text books can be printed. But in the meantime a syllabus has been drawn up which the teachers will be able to follow without difficulty. The main thing is : the kiddie are back at school again!
