

Story: Jewish New Year Service at Amsterdam (Request by CMHQ)

The Jewish New Year is celebrated as the anniversary of the Divine Creation of the world, and at the same time as the birthday of Man.

According to the Jewish Calendar it is now 5706. It is celebrated from sundown to sundown of the first two days of the Hebrew month of Tishri and marks religiously the beginning of a ten day period of repentance which ends on the day of Atonement.

The traditional blowing of the Shofar, which is a ram's horn, plays a prominent part in the rituals of New Years prayers. It calls upon all men to awaken from their lethargy and build a new world. Significant Biblical portions are read from the Scrolls of Law to the entire congregation to remind them of the sacred inspiration of mankind's ideals.

Story: Cdn scientists study German war research development.

As the war with Germany drew to a close, the Allied Governments organised teams of research scientists from their respective countries to immediately enter Germany as the country was overrun and to study plant by plant research and development made during the war.

The Cdn team was organised by BRIG.F.F. FULTON, St John, N.B., CMHQ, who selected top men in their various fields in Canada to be ready to move into Germany to make immediate surveys of German War plants. These scientists to make full reports on each plant and gather samples. These reports and samples are gathered together at a central point in England where their findings are made available to all interested Allied countries. The team in Germany head by MAJ.MARGARET EVIS, CWAC.

The plant selected for this story: (1) Chemical organization: the I.G. Farben Industries Ltd., as vast chemical organization with many plants throughout Germany employing two million people. The plant they had at Horchst near Frankfurt was selected for this story. (2) Industry selected was metal alloys - The United German Metal Works at Heddernheimer.



The Hofers Shoe Factory at Varel, was engaged during the war years with full time production of German military shoes. Immediately after being overrun by the Cdn Army, A.M.G. stopped all production. Today, with the Germany Army being disbanded, and of first interest to Mil Gov is the Peat Production on German farms to feed Germany this coming winter, the change over to full production of workmans shoes has been affected. Today all workmans shoes made are on direct order from Mil Gov and production has reached 10,000 pairs per month. Only enough these boots are called Victory Boots.

As Germany proper was overrun by the Allies, a newly formed unit called The Information Control Unit, began its work. This work was divided into three phases.

First: Closing down of all German presses - stepping German Publications of every description.

Second: Commencement of publication of limited numbers of papers printed by Germans and Edited under an Allied staff containing no local news, mainly world news, serviced from England.

Thirdly: Editing and producing and publishing papers by German Editors and Publishers under licence from the Control Commission - these papers being subject only to post publication censorship by representative of the Allied Control Commission. This third phase allows for both local and World News.

In Oldenburg an Information Control Unit has been set up under CAPT.B.G. WISE, and they have established a by-weekly edition which services the area occupied by Cdns. This is a four-page paper, and a two-page paper published on the other four days of the week which is distributed only in Osnaburck, Wilhelmshaven and Oldenburg. The by-weekly has a circulation of 400,000 and the two-page sheet 100,000.
