Regulations banning weddings in Germany forced LT.RAY BROCKER, of Vancouver, B.C., and LT. N/S. ELIZABTH ANNE MOULT, of Belleville, Ont., to go to Groningen, Holland, where the wedding was solemnized at 0900 yesterday morning. The wedding party returned to Germany where the union was blessed in an ancient German church at Sengwarden (pronounced Zengvarden). It was the first time an all Canadian wedding has been performed in a German church. The church, parts of whose structure date back to 1250, is the mest prominent building in the village. Officers and men of the Groom's Regiment, The Canadian Scottish, and Nursing Sisters and doctors from 7 C.G.H. (the bride's unit) were in attendance, A Guard of Honour and two Cdn Scottish Pipers lined the walk from the church to the bridal car.

Following the ceremony the bridal party went to the Offrs' Mess at Sengwarden Barracks where toasts were drunk to the bride. The entire party then left for the Sisters' mess at 7 C.G.H. where the reception was held. A huge wedding cake faced the happy couple as they entered the lounge in the Sisters' mess.
