With flood waters swelling rivers beyond capacity bridges being swept away, communications with the outside CAOF have become very limited, 7 RCCE Regt stationed at Leer have a squadron of a regt at Wenner which is on the other side of the River Ems, are finding good use of their vehicle called the "Seep" which is just a jeep turned into a water vehicle. They have a bus which comes from Wenner with personnel and unit business, is transported across the narrow swift flowing Ems River, where it is met by another unit bus. German civilians are transported across in an old row boat, the fare being one mark per person.

Re-education of Germany through her schools has been started in the British-occupied zone by the Allied Military Government. Classes for teachers are held under AMG supervision, so that schools for German children can re-open, with tutors who are not charged with instilling Nazi propaganda along with the reading, writing and arithmetic they drum into the heads of their pupils. School text-books issued by the Nazi regime, and which showed heavily the hand of Herr Goebbels, have been called in, and with thousands of other banned volumes have been pulped and processed to supply paper for new text-books which teach the three R's, but leave out the propaganda. Thus the young generation of Germans can be educated in the ways of democracy, instead of learning of the greatness of Hitler and the glory of war, the destiny of Germany to rule the world and hatred of the Jews -- all themes dwelt on in the Nazi textbooks formerly used. This series of pictures show a little of the re-education campaign.

Day in and day out, Sundays excluded, the Maple Leaf rolls off the presses in a small publishing plant at Delmenhorst, Germany. "For Canadian Occupation Forces" says a line carried over the paper's masthead in each edition, and the avowed object of its editors is to keep the CACF informed on latest news at home and in Germany-- and for emphasis on the home news. To help fill the gap left by closing the U.K. edition, circulation run of the only remaining "Maple Leaf" has been increased by 6,000, to supply ~~20,000~~ ~~20,000~~ ~~20,000~~ Canadians still serving in Britain. Total circulation is now approximately 20,000 copies daily. *PK*

Born in the rubble of Caen in July, 1944, while its older brother, the original "Maple Leaf" was still being published in Rome for Canadian Troops fighting in Italy, the Northwest Europe edition has followed the trail of the victorious Canadian Army across western Europe, with stopping places at Brussels and Amsterdam, before arriving at its present publishing site in Delmenhorst, in the CACF zone.

Chicago meat packers use everything but the pig's squeal - and that seems sheer waste to the boys at Canadian Ordnance Salvage Depot at Oldenburg in Germany. Ordnance staff at Oldenburg wrap all squeals neatly in air-proof packages and issue them to OR saxophone students. No discarded military equipment, Canadian or German, is allowed to go to waste - the leather lining of German steel helmets is salvaged for shoe repairs; the handles of the ceremonial swords for which the Junker officers of the German High Command have no more use are sent to handicraft shops to be made up into souvenirs by the lads of the Canadian Occupation Force when time hangs heavily on their hands. Wrecked planes scattered over the German countryside are brought to Canadian Ordnance at Oldenburg for salvage.

LEAD-IN STORY FOR PIX 60824 to 60835SOLDIER-OWNED DOGS JOIN THE REPAT STREAM

Armies have a habit of collecting pets, and the Canadian Army is no exception. In his travels through Sicily, Italy, the countries of North-west Europe and finally into Germany, the Canadian soldier assembled a variety of animals, some as regimental mascots, most as just the individual soldier's "best friend". Dogs naturally are in highest favor, and when the Canadian Army Occupation Force found its job in Germany completed and started to move homewards, the matter of what to do with the dogs became of high importance.

Most owners were loath to leave their canine pals behind, so a system was evolved whereby the dogs - providing the owner was willing to lay out a little cash - could join the repatriation stream and have an excellent chance of settling down with his Canadian owner in the broad Dominion.

There are certain rules and regulations that all dogs moving from country to country must meet and army-owned dogs are no different than the Duchess' favorite Peke. Entering the United Kingdom or Canada they must serve six months in quarantine, a protection against carrying rabies, foot-and-mouth disease and other ailments into the host country. And keeping a dog for six months costs money. So the soldier in CAOF who wants to take his dog home deposits enough cash for upkeep of his dog in the United Kingdom for six months. Charges are on a sliding scale, depending on rank (and pay) of the owner - five pounds sterling for the ordinary soldier, 10 for warrant officers, 15 for officers up to the rank of captain and 20 for majors and up. Then the dog goes aboard ship, and arrives at an English port, to be taken into tow by Movement Control officers and despatched to the kennels of the Royal Army Veterinary Corps at Chilbolton Downs near Winchester. He may stay only a few days, until ship passage to Canada is arranged, but while there he receives the best care that the British Army's trained veterinary corps can provide.

His master meanwhile visits the Army Movement Control office in London and is given all the details about shipment of his pet, and entry to Canada. He also makes another deposit - this time to cover feeding and care while in quarantine in Canada - the sum of \$50 for non-commissioned ranks and \$75 if he is an officer. His previous payment in sterling is used to defray costs while in the United Kingdom, and any part of the sum not expended, depending on the length of time the dog is in England, is refunded to him. Thus the owner does not pay twice, but pays on the basis of where his pet spends the stipulated six months' quarantine.

Once shipping space has been arranged the dogs are moved to an embarkation port in Army trucks and put aboard. Kennels on the top deck are their homes during the ocean voyage and the ships' cook looks after feeding. Arrived in Halifax the dog is sent to the Government quarantine compound at that "eastern Canadian port", to put in any unserved portion of the six months quarantine time before becoming a full-fledged resident of Canada.
