

INDEX TO DONALD GORDON'S SCRAPBOOKS

FOREWORD

The scrapbooks on Donald Gordon's career as chairman and president of Canadian National Railways were compiled by the Public Relations Department from contemporary newspapers and periodicals. They are divided into five series:

1. News 17 volumes
2. Editorials 10 volumes
3. Features and Biography 3 volumes
4. Photographs and Cartoons 3 volumes
5. Personal and Social 5 volumes

Each series has its own volume numbering sequence (e.g. News volumes are numbered 1-17, Personal and Social 1-5).

The index identifies each series by a letter preceding the volume page citation.

N - News
E - Editorials
F - Features and Biography
PH - Photographs and Cartoons
PE - Personal and Social

For example: N 4:73 indicates News, volume 4, page 73
PH 2:10 indicates Photographs and Cartoons, volume 2, page 10

Generally, the scrapbooks have been indexed in considerable depth. However, there are several exceptions:

1. Neither the year-end review nor the annual report have been indexed as reported in the press, except broadly, under the headings "Annual report" and "Year-end review".
2. Press reports of the proceedings of the Sessional Committee's annual hearings also have not been indexed (except under "Canada. Parliament. House. Committee on Railways, Air lines and Shipping"). The actual proceedings, since 1950, have been indexed by CN Headquarters Library.
3. The contents of Donald Gordon's speeches have not been indexed. The Public Relations Department possesses most of them, and a separate index to the actual texts has been prepared. Press reports of any speeches not available in the Department have, of course, been indexed in the scrapbook index. Under the heading "Gordon, Donald. Speeches", the speeches are listed, and an entry has been made the organization to whom each speech was delivered.

On the microfilm copy, it was occasionally necessary to film certain pages several times, because of folded clippings that, when unfolded, obscured other portions of the page. The reader should scan adjacent pages, if he finds that the clipping he wishes to see is hidden or folded; the clipping in question should appear in entirety on another frame.

A list of volumes, and the period each covers, precedes the index.
