1. Correspondence and Memoranda, 1931-1942. 4 inches (vol. 1, folders 1-11).
2. Minutes of the Book of Remembrance Committee, 1931-1939. 1/2 inch (vol. 2, folder 12).

Included are a number of drafts and notes taken at meetings.

3. Model Book, 1936. 1/4 inch (vol. 2, folder 13).
Small scale model of the Book of Remembrance illustrating its layout and page numbering.

4. Drafts of Wording, n.d. 29 pages. (vol. 2, folder 14).
Proposals for the English, French and Latin phraseology used in the introductory pages of the book. Many of these are duplicated, with the relevant correspondence, in the correspondence and memoranda.

5. Reports, 1932, n.d. 1/2 inch (vol. 2, folder 15).
Included is a report of the sub-committee on the Book of Remembrance made at the outset of the project in 1932, plus progress reports covering 1931-1941 compiled at a later date by Col. Osborne.

6. Dedication, 1942. 1 page (vol. 2, folder 16).
Speech apparently given on the occasion of the dedication of the Book, 11 November 1942.

7. Addresses - c.1940. 9 pages (vol. 2, folder 17).
Names and addresses on scraps of paper, probably collected when an assistant, and later replacement for Mr. Purves was being sought.

8. Financial, 1940-1943. 1/4 inch (vol. 2, folders 18-20).
A very incomplete collection of financial records consisting of estimates for presentation to the Minister of National Defence, a few odd bills and expense accounts and some pencilled pay sheets for the staff working on the book.

9. Printed Material, 1/4 inch (vol. 2, folder 21).
A miscellaneous collection of material relating mostly to Unemployment Insurance, but including an Interpreter's Book for Liverpool Cathedral.
