There is a note written by Dr. Selwyn (17 April 1883) in which he refuses the application because of Mr. Broad's involvement ". . . with the publication of the letter and article reflecting on the management of this Branch . . . "
- File 4 Letter written by Dr. Selwyn to Senator D. L. Macpherson, Acting Minister of the Interior, on the 17th of April 1883, in which the Senator is informed of the letter

published in the Toronto Mail (6 April 1883) and the article which appeared in the Montreal Witness (13 April 1883) reflecting on the management of the Geological Survey. Dr. Selwyn explains that it is his opinion that Mr. Broad is in great part responsible for these attacks and for this reason is deferring action on Broad's recent promotion.
