Edith Fanny Paul was born in 1861, the daughter of Fanny Wookey and Mr. Cornelius Danford Paul. Her mother, who married in 1860 in Toronto at the age of 19, was also a musician. Edith met Paderewski in New York City when she was buying a piano there. She married Mr. George Morton and spent the rest of her life in St. Thomas, Ontario. The collection includes manuscripts of her music from 1898 until her death and correspondence in the later 1920's concerning her publications. As well, there is a book in which Mrs. Morton listed all the music which she either played or was interested in acquiring or hearing.

One copy of Ma Dulcinea was transferred to the Printed Collection along with an album of music of Mrs. C. D. Paul (Album 31). Further information on the family history may be obtained from the Canadian History Department of the Metropolitan Toronto Library, the Brant County Museum and the Elgin County Pioneer Museum. Some family names are: Baker, Morton, Paul, Roberts, and Rolph.
