The letters were written during 1943 and 1944 while Pel was working in a factory in Germany, presumably as part of the forced labour implemented by the Nazis during their occupation of the Netherlands. Pel refers to Maria as Ria throughout the letters. He writes about the work he is doing, his health, and his hopes to be allowed to return to Holland. Textual Art	1	2	Gek en Wijs tijdens Seyss	File consists of a small, illustrated book describing the various ways the Dutch people suffered under Nazi occupation during the Second World War. The book is written in Dutch with humourous colour illustrations on each page. The title translates to "Crazy and Wise During Seyss," which is a reference to Arthur Seyss-Inquart who was the Reich Commissioner of the German occupied Netherlands. He was responsible for the deportation and murder of approximately 120 000 Dutch Jews in concentration camps and the forced labour of over 500 000 Dutch civilians. Each set of pages includes a contrast. For example Dutch Police actively confiscating bicycles under Nazi orders is compared to Police chosing to turn away so that they do not see a bicycle to confiscate. This file also includes a handwritten translation into English of each page provided by the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 in 2019.	ca. 1945

The earliest letters date from 1945-1946 before their marriage while Louis is still serving in the military immediately after the Second World War. There are also letters from during their marriage while Maria is visiting Holland with their daughter.
