Established in 1925 by Alexander A. Kelen, an Hungarian immigrant, the Alexander A. Kelen Travel Agency of Montreal, in co-operation with continental European shipping lines, has since its inception assisted central Europeans to emigrate to Canada. It has forwarded money to central Europeans from their friends and relatives in Canada and, especially following World War II, sent clothes and food articles from Canada to continental Europe. With the return of prosperity to central Europe in the 1960's the agency has been active largely in arranging tourist travel.

Presented by Alexander A. Kelen of Montreal in 1975 and 1976. Copies of two maps showing the origin of Hungarian immigrants to Canada during the years 1930, 1939 and 1948 were transferred to Map Division.

Finding Aid No. 1411 is a list of file titles. Bound ledgers are numbered in one continuous sequence and other files are numbered beginning with "one" in each volume.

Consisting primarily of financial records, 1928-1964, and correspondence, 1930-1970, the records of the Kelen Travel Agency illustrate the many faceted links which continue to exist between the emigrant and his or her old homeland.
