Patients include First Nations people and Inuit of all ages. Many of the individuals are identified and some of their communities of origin are known. Communities mention include Teslin First Nations; a First Nations woman from Yellowknife; a First Nations man from Fort Vermillion; a teenage girl from Yukon; Cambridge Bay (Ikaluututiaq); and Kugluktuk (Coppermine). Also includes a photograph of a whole wall of Indigenous crafts on display and 10 images of field work at the bridge on the Canal Road en route to Fort Norman (Tulita, NT); Fort Resolution, NT; Lac La Biche, AB; Imperial Mills, AB; Driftpile, AB; Hoy Lakes, AB; Janvier Band, AB; Chard, AB; Carmax (Carmacks), YT; and Ross River, YT.	1952

Examples include checking the lungs of an Inuk woman with facial tattoos. Many of the individuals are identified and some of their communities of origin are known. There is one man from Scarce First Nations man; an Inuk woman and baby from Cambridge Bay; an Inuk woman and twins from Bathurst Inlet; an Inuk woman and baby from Coppermine; and a six-year-old Inuk boy (named) from Pelly River, N.W.T. (was "adopted" by N.W.A.C. Communications and Rescue Flight when he was flown from Cambridge Bay).	1951

Newsletter includes Christmas greetings from various officials; poems by "Aunty Myrt"; an article by an Anglican minister about abolishing shamanism in Taloyoak; a copy of Citizenship Address by Mabel Pokiak; three photos of patients in the recreation centre; Indigenous related newspaper clippings; Christmas stories and articles; political cartoon style sketches by a patient; letters from former patients in Vancouver, Winnipeg, Medicine Hat, and Ross River; birth and engagement announcements; and ward news which contains many names of Inuit and First Nations patients.
