The papers of Sir George Cornewall Lewis form a part of the Harpton Court Deeds and Documents at the National Library of Wales. Sir George Cornewall Lewis was Secretary for War from 22 July 1861 to his death, 13 April 1863. His tenure as Secretary for War coincided with a war scare with the United States over what has come to be known as the Trent Affair. Lewis was responsible for the despatch of British troops to reinforce the garrisons of the British North American provinces. The documents in this collection outline the information gathered by Lewis.

Statements and Returns, 1861, of military equipment and manpower in British North America; and Memoranda, Correspondence, and Confidential Reports, 1861-1863, concerning the defence of British North America and the threat of war with the United States.

These records complement and supplement the holdings from the British Military and Naval Records (RG 8, I) and the Governors General Records (RG 7), and the papers of Sir Edmund Walker Head (MG 24, A 20). Some of Head's and Lewis's private correspondence have previously been copied from the Harpton Court Papers (Reel M-184).
