#### CUSTODIAL HISTORY

HISTORIQUE DE CONSERVATION: Au début du XIXe siècle, les fonds des Archives nationales demeuraient dispersés dans plusieurs maisons de Paris. Dans un effort de centralisation, le gouvernement leur affecta en 1808 l'hôtel de Soubise, rue des Francs-Bourgeois à Paris, auquel sont venus s'ajouter aux XIXe et XXe siècles plusieurs constructions nouvelles et s'agréger les immeubles voisins.

#### ADMIN. HISTORY / BIOGRAPHY

HISTOIRE ADMIN./BIOGRAPHIE: <46925> Le 29 juillet 1789, l'Assemblée constituante créa un dépôt pour la conservation de ses actes originaux. Le 4 août, Armand-Gaston Camus, avocat au Parlement et député de Paris, se vit confier la direction de ce dépôt qui, le 7 septembre 1790,

reçut le nom d'Archives nationales. Dès 1792, cette nouvelle institution commençait à rassembler et à classer non seulement les papiers des organismes issus du nouveau régime (assemblées et tribunaux révolutionnaires, comités, etc.), mais aussi ceux des grandes administrations de l'ancien régime, des corporations supprimées par la Révolution, des grandes et petites juridictions et des particuliers émigrés ou condamnés. L'extension des Archives fut favorisée par plusieurs décrets prescrivant le transfert dans ce dépôt des papiers qui ne sont plus nécessaires au service courant des ministères et administrations de l'État français.
